## What is the purpose of this update?

This document tells you how the APN AREIT PIE Fund has performed and what fees were charged. The document will help you to compare the fund with other funds. Implemented Investment Solutions Limited prepared this update in accordance with the Financial Markets Conduct Act 2013. This information is not audited and may be updated.

## Description of this fund

Objective: to provide investors with a consistent, relatively high level of income combined with some capital growth, sourced primarily from AREITs listed on the ASX.

Strategy: the Fund invests in an Australian Unit Trust ('Underlying Fund') managed by APN Funds Management Limited ('APN'). The Underlying Fund invests in Australian Real Estate Investment Trust ('AREIT') shares. The Fund targets a position of being fully hedged back to the New Zealand dollar.

### Example of how this applies to an investor<sup>4</sup>


Small differences in fees and charges can have a big impact on your investment over the long term.

Anthony had \$10,000 in the fund when the fund received its first contribution, on 10 March 2017, and did not make any further contributions. At the end of the period to 31 March 2017 Anthony received a return after fund charges were deducted of \$171 (that is 1.71% of his initial \$10,000). This gives Anthony a total return after tax of \$163 for the period.



## Notes

- <sup>1</sup> A combination of actual Fund returns and market index returns have been used to determine the risk indicator as the Fund has not been operating for the required five years. The risk indicator may therefore provide a less reliable indicator of the Fund's future volatility. Market index returns have been used for the period to 10 March 2017.
- <sup>2</sup> The market index return is the S&P/ASX 300 AREIT Index return in Australian dollars with an adjustment for currency hedging to New Zealand dollars calculated by Implemented Investment Solutions Limited.
- <sup>3</sup> We have assumed there are no extraordinary expenses such as costs of any litigation or unitholder meetings.
- <sup>4</sup> As the Fund has not existed for a full year, this calculation is based on the returns from the date of the first Fund contribution (10 March 2017).
